Method:

1. Log in to cPanel
 1. Open your web browser and go to your cPanel login URL
 2. Enter your cPanel username and password.
 3. Click **Log in**.
2. Access the MySQL Database Section
3. In the **Databases** section of cPanel, click on **Manage My Databases**.
4. Select the Database to Repair
5. Scroll down to the **Modify Databases** section.
6. Locate the **Repair Database** option.
7. From the dropdown list, select the database you want to repair.
8. Click the **Repair Database** button.
